

## THE CITY HAS LEVERAGED A VARIETY OF FUNDING SOURCES TO SUCCESSFULLY IMPLEMENT THIS EXCITING NEW PROJECT

By pursuing competitive grants and using supplemental funding, the new City-wide trail project was funded. This \$6.7+ million project is funded as follows:

### \$6.2M ATP GRANT

The Active Transportation Program (ATP) grant money the City was awarded can only be used to fund projects that result in increases in walking and biking — which is a perfect fit for our new City-wide trail!


#### The main reasons the project was selected:

1. City staff collaborated with multiple agencies to make sure the new trail could connect to multiple schools, parks, neighborhoods, and local shopping.
2. The preliminary project design showcases best-practices for trails — creating a vision that builds both local and regional connectivity.
3. The new trail will enhance safety, by reducing overgrown vegetation, encouraging frequent family trail users, and building improved access for our local Police Department to conduct regular patrols.

### \$595,080 OTHER FUNDS\*

Per Capita Grant Funding, Measure A Funds, Park Impact Fees, Tree Mitigation Funds, and Storm Water Utility Funds.

### WHAT MAKES THIS PROJECT SPECIAL:

- The project provides a safe and convenient connection between key destinations in the City (Schools, Parks, Sunrise MarketPlace and numerous neighborhoods).

- The project is part of a broader vision to provide multi-use trails and regional connectivity to Roseville, Folsom Lake, and ultimately the entire Sacramento region.



### TRAIL HIGHLIGHTS

- 2.9 mile multi-use trail between Sunrise Boulevard (near Arcade Creek Park Preserve) and Watchtel Way, largely following an existing Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) corridor easement.
- The trail will connect to another exciting, new project: our City's first regional park! The new regional park will include Arcade Creek Park Preserve, Tempo Park, and more.
- This project is part of the City's overall goal to increase walkability and safety by improving conditions for pedestrians and bicyclists throughout our community's unique system of creekside trails, passive open space, and parks.
