

Your Recycle Schedule is Now Called Recycle Week A

Starting in July, your recycle collection schedule will change. See schedule below for those changes.

Starting in July, recycling collection service will be split into either Week A or Week B. You are Week A and will have a change in your recycle service schedule.

The transition for the new collection schedule will be as follows:

- ▶ June 20-24: NO RECYCLING COLLECTION
- ▶ June 27 - July 1: Recycling Collection
- ▶ July 4-8: Recycling Collection
- ▶ July 11-15: NO RECYCLING COLLECTION
- ▶ July 18-22: Recycling Collection

What is SB 1383?

Recycling Your Organics

Starting July 4, 2022, Republic Services® will launch a residential organic waste collection program to comply with a new state law, Senate Bill 1383.

What does this mean for residents?

State law requires that ZERO organic waste goes in the trash cart. Therefore, all organic waste previously thrown in the trash must now go in the green organic waste cart (starting July 4, 2022). All Citrus Heights customer households will receive a complimentary countertop kitchen pail to keep organic waste separate until the contents of the pail are placed in the green organic waste cart for weekly collection service.

Highlights

- ▶ Senate Bill (SB) 1383 – Requires Organic Waste Collection Statewide
- ▶ Starting July 4, food waste recycling begins for all residential customers
- ▶ Organic waste cart (formerly green waste cart) will be serviced weekly
- ▶ All residential customers will receive a countertop food waste kitchen pail
- ▶ Organic waste collected from residential homes will be composted



All food waste previously disposed of in trash cart must now be placed into the organic waste cart.

Complimentary kitchen pails will be delivered to each customer household in July.

How do I use my complimentary kitchen pail?

- ▶ Store the kitchen pail in a convenient place
- ▶ Scrape food waste from your plate into your kitchen pail
- ▶ Dump the food waste from the pail into your green organic waste cart
- ▶ Once you empty contents from your kitchen pail, return your pail to a convenient location

What is organic waste?

Organic waste includes food waste, green waste (landscape and pruning, flowers, leaves), and food-soiled paper items, such as pizza boxes or used paper plates and coffee filters.

What happens to my organic waste?

Residential organic waste will be processed and turned into compost.

Who is affected by SB 1383?

Everyone. Residents, businesses, multifamily properties and complexes must comply with the law and have an organics recycling program.

When will the city's residential organics recycling program begin?

Starting July 4, 2022, all food waste must be collected for recycling. Residents must deposit food waste, food scraps and food-soiled paper into the organic waste cart (formerly your green waste cart).

What if I already compost at home?

You do not need to change your composting habits. Items that cannot be composted at home (like meat, dairy, bones) will go into your organic waste cart.
