### **CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes**

### Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

In 2023, the City partnered with several unique nonprofit organizations to implement programs and critical public services such as meal delivery to Citrus Heights seniors, supported an emergency food closet and an afterschool program. Additionally, housing counseling and navigation services, dispute resolution and fair housing services provided to residents via calls and internet-based Renters Helpline.

The City continues to support low-income homeowners to make health and safety improvements to their home through the Citys Community Development Block Grant Program. Prior years funding was awarded to the Critical Home Repair Grant Program. This program provided 13 low-income mobilehome owners with a grant up to \$20,000 for health and safety repairs to their homes. Rebuilding Together Sacramento, a local nonprofit organization that has been preserving and revitalizing homes in the Sacramento region administered the program.

The 2023 Residential Street Resurfacing Project is expected to be underway by mid-April 2024. This project will add accessible curb ramps and sidewalks to neighborhoods and other high traffic intersections to increase pedestrian safety, walkability, and meet Americans with Disability Acts requirements.

In 2020, the City received \$920,226 in CDBG Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) grant funds. With the availability of CDBG-CV funds to continue to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 by addressing food insecurity and providing resources to unhoused individuals. City staff has worked with nonprofits in providing essential services to vulnerable populations impacted by the COVID-19. The City has expended a total of \$891,460.02 of its CDBG-CV funds and is on track to meet all associated expenditures deadlines. Funded CDBG-CV activities include expanding food closet and household distribution that addressed food insecurities, provided youth workforce development program, and essential resource services to the unhoused clients in assist with obtaining permanent housing.

The goals align closely to the City Council 2021-2024 strategic goals, which include maintain and enhance fascal stability, maintain public infrstructure, and enhance alternative modes of transportation, diversify for a reslient economy, preserve and enhance public safety, and

enhance community vibrancy and engagement.

- Foster affordable housing.
- Services for people experiencing homelessness.
- Services for seniors and youth.
- Provide public services responsive to current need.
- Construct/upgrade public facilities.
- Improve accessibility.
- Affirmatively further fair housing.
- Effectively administer CDBG program.

The 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan identifies the following housing goals:

- Enhance the quality of safety of the existing housing stock.
- Provide programs that assist first-time homebuyers to stabilize homeownership rates and to increase the level of resident investment in neighborhoods.

Projects funded in 2023 addressed priorities included in the Consolidated Plan. The City continues to use CDBG funds primarily to assist households, especially seniors, youth, people experiencing homelessness, and with disabilities. Overall, the City used its CDBG funds to make substantial investments in the community and maintained commitment to the City's unhoused community and low-income population.

The City's CDBG-funded projects took place at various locations throughout the City. Most programs the City offered, including the critical home repair grant program and all public services, were made citywide.

### Leveraging

Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.

There is no federal requirement for the City to match CDBG funds with other non-federal program resources. In FY 23/24 the City allocated \$104,498 in General Fund monies to nonprofits providing community service in the City. With respect to public services, the City requires all Subrecipients to identify other resources that will be leveraged during the program year to operate and implement CDBG supportive activities. It is the City's intent to ensure adequate non-federal and private funds are available, thus minimizing the dependence on federal funds.

The City did not use any publicly owned property in PY 23 to address the needs identified in the Consolidated Plan, although the City completed its first multi-family affordable housing development in over twenty years, Sunrise Pointe meets the housing needs of lower-income households. This project was completed in December 2023.

# Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

The City is 98% built out so there is little land available for new housing developments. Additionally, this means the City does not have substantial development fees with which to fund these efforts. Furthermore, due to the City's revenue neutrality agreement with the county, the City did not receive property tax revenue for twenty-five years since the City incorporated in 1997. January 2023 is the first year the City received property tax revenue. Also, the elimination of Redevelopment funding at the state level makes the development of affordable housing increasingly challenging. The City's prior year CDBG funds funded housing accomplishments for the program year, the Critical Home Repair Grant Program which offers grants to low-income mobilehome homeowners needing assistance to make critical health and safety repairs to their homes. The City worked with Rebuilding Together Sacramento and completed 13 critical home repairs in PY 2023.

January 2020, the City Council approved the allocation of \$3.58 million from the Citrus Heights HOME Investment Partnership Fund. Sunrise Pointe, a multifamily community providing permanent supportive housing, is located at 7424 Sunrise Boulevard in Citrus Heights. The 46 one, two, and three-bedroom units assisted with Project-Based Vouchers administered by Sacramento Housing Redevelopment Agency (SHRA). Built by developer Jamboree Housing Corporation, Sunrise Pointe is the first affordable housing development in Citrus Heights in 20 years. Amenities include on-site access to service providers, community rooms, covered BBQ/picnic area, outdoor tables, a playground, covered lounge area, and on-site property management. This project was completed December of 2023.

### Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.

The City and Rebuilding Together Sacramento partnered to make it possible for low-income households to receive critical health and safety home repairs. The Critical Home Repair Grant program contributes towards continued preservation of existing housing stock and priorities identified in the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan.

In future years, the City anticipates continuing to allocate resources to housing opportunities for lowincome households, including people experiencing homelessness, and helping low-income households maintain their homes.

### **Narrative Information**

The table above represents households assisted through the Critical Home Repair Grant program which is open to mobile home homeowners at or below eighty (80) percent of the area median income. This program helps eligible homeowners receive a grant for critical health and safety home repairs including improvements or modifications to meet accessibility needs. With funding in the form of a grant,

homeowners can bring unsafe and substandard housing up to code. Overall, this program helps maintain affordable housing and improves the condition of the Citys housing stock for future generations.

# Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

In PY 2023, the City funded a full-time and part-time homeless navigator through Sacramento Self-Help Housing (SSHH). The navigators performed proactive outreach to unsheltered homeless residents, meeting with them where they are staying, and assists them by evaluating their needs, obtaining documents required to enroll in housing programs, completing information necessary to enter them into the Countywide Homeless Management and Information System (HMIS), and possible locating housing.

After the dissolution of SSHH in June of 2023, the City began evaluating alternative options to allow for continued homeless outreach navigation services. The City approached Sacramento County Department of Homeless Services and Housing (DHSH) to consider a partnership to build on recent county efforts on outreach navigation services provided by Community HealthWorks. The City, the County, and Community HealthWorks have a mutual desire to improve the coordination and combining of efforts to meet the needs of the unhoused and help move individuals out of homelessness.

September 2023, the City entered a partnership with Sacramento County DHSH to deliver the Community Based Navigation Program to the City. This program will provide homeless outreach and navigation services to unsheltered individuals in the City.

Sacramento County, DHSH expanded on its new service model used throughout unincorporated Sacramento County, with nonprofit Community HealthWorks, to provide support services, emergency shelter, interim, and permanent housing. Community HealthWorks employes Community Health Workers (CHWs) to deliver services and establish a positive relationship with local community organizations, residents, and businesses to foster a supportive coalition for unsheltered individuals in the City.

Through the collaboration and ARPA district-directed funding allocation of \$344, 836 from Sacramento County District 4 Supervisor Sue Frost, funding will be directed to DHSH to support one (1) full-time CHW, client assistance support and associated administrative costs for the City through December 2025.

In addition, through this partnership the Community Based Navigation Program will support reaching outreach to homeless persons and addressing individual needs.

### Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

City staff participates in the Homeless Assistance Resource Team (HART), a group of agencies,

nonprofits, faith-based organizations, members of the business community and interested individuals dedicated to addressing the City's homeless issue. The goal of HART is to provide homeless individuals with resources so they may have better access to housing options. In addition, HART operates an annual Winter Sanctuary Program that provides a dry, safe place to sleep, hot meals, to-go breakfast, and services to help pave a path out of homelessness. The Winter Sanctuary operates December through February and services up to 25 clients per night.

As mentioned, the City contracts with the County of Sacramento DHSH to deliver the Community Based Navigation Program to the City. The program provides homeless and outreach services to unsheltered individuals in the City. Sacramento County DHSH expanded services with Community HealthWorks, a nonprofit to provide support services, emergency shelter, interim and permanent housing to those who are experiencing homelessness or are homeless. Through the collaboration, Community HealthWorks provides the City one full-time Community Health Worker (CHW) to provide support services for unsheltered individuals in the City.

Also, the City is an active participant in regional efforts to address the needs of people experiencing homelessness. The City continues to work with the Sacramento Continuum of Care (CoC), which is a 30+ member Board, that includes representatives from organizations serving individuals experiencing homelessness or who were formerly homeless and other interested, relevant organizations within the Sacramento County. The Sacramento CoC cover all the cities, towns, and unincorporated area of Sacramento County. The City's Housing and Human Services Program Coordinator is a participant of the Sacramento County CoC Board and attends regular monthly meetings.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

The City provided funding to SSHH, which offered housing counseling and navigator services to households who are at-risk of becoming homeless and connecting them to resources and services in hopes to maintain stable housing. The Navigators work closely with the City of Citrus Heights, Citrus Heights Police Department, Citrus Heights HART, and local nonprofit service providers, they reached several residents that needed assistance locating stable housing including those who may become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care.

In addition, the City contracted with the County of Sacramento, Department of Homeless Services and Housing (DHSH) to deliver the Community Based Navigation Program. The program provides outreach and services to unhoused clients living in Citrus Heights including services to get the client to next steps to becoming housed. DHSH expanded services with Community HealthWorks, a nonprofit to provide support services, emergency shelter, interim and permanent housing to those who are experiencing

homelessness in the City. Through the collaboration, Community HealthWorks provides the City one fulltime Community Health Worker (CHW) to provide support services for unhoused individuals. A CHW worker may offer motel vouchers and or assistance with housing on a case-by-case basis, this addressess houisng, health, and socials service needs.

Through active participation in the Continuum of Care (CoC), which is currently administered by Sacramento Steps Forward, the City maintains strong involvement with Sacramento Steps Forward as it coordinates the regional homeless response system. The City's Housing and Human Services Program Coordinator currently serves on the Sacramento Count Continuum of Care (CoC) Advisory Board. The Continuum of Care Board is responsible for advising the Sacramento Steps Forward Board of Directors on policy around the issue of homelessness. The goal of the Advisory Board is to ensure Sacramento Steps Forward retains a broad representation of the constituents in the community, allowing the organization to establish a more efficient method of community planning and evaluation.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

The City coordinates and participates in the Homeless Assistance Resource Team (HART), a group of agencies, nonprofits, faith-based organizations, and interested individuals dedicated to addressing Citrus Heights homeless issues. The goal of HART members is to provide homeless individuals with resources to access housing.

As mentioned, the City contracts with the County of Sacramento DHSH to deliver the Community Based Navigation Program to the City. The program provides homeless and outreach services to unsheltered individuals in the City. Sacramento County DHSH expanded services with Community HealthWorks, a nonprofit to provide support services, emergency shelter, interim and permanent housing to those who are experiencing homelessness or are homeless. Through the collaboration, Community HealthWorks provides the City one full-time Community Health Worker (CHW) to provide support services for unsheltered individuals in the City.

In addition, Citrus Heights Police Department may contact the CHW when working with people experiencing homelessness to assist people in securing services and housing.

### CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

### Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA) is the public housing agency serving the City of Citrus Heights. SHRA is independent of Citrus Heights, and the City retains no control over their funding or implementation of programs. However, we coordinate with SHRA when possible. Refer to the SHRA Public Housing Authority Annual Action Plan at https://www.shra.org/financial-performance-and-strategic-planning-documents/ for information on the ways that SHRA addresses public housing needs.

# Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

SHRA encourages public housing residents to participate in policy, procedure, and program implementation of development through its Resident Advisory Board. In addition, the Housing Authority recognizes Resident Committees throughout the Sacramento Region; the residents are elected bodies representing residents in their respective complexes. SHRA also distributes a quarterly newsletter to all residents, containing relevant news, information on training and employment opportunities, and other community resources available to public housing residents. Public housing residents also participate in the development of SHRA' s five-year annual plan. The Resident Services Division distributes a survey to prioritize resident needs, and short- and long- term improvements.

### Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

No action is necessary.

## CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

A continued supply of housing to all household income levels is essential to meet the needs of the residents of the City. The City is largely "built out" and the supply is dependent not only on production, but on the preservation of existing affordable housing. To ensure the continuing production of affordable housing, the City has examined possible constraints and barriers. Constraints to affordable housing are both governmental and non-governmental. Governmental constraints include land use controls, entitlement processing, fees, and building codes.

Land uses controls are necessary to ensure orderly and appropriate development and growth in the City. Fees, land dedication and public improvements are usually required as part of land development and entitlement processing to ensure an adequate supply of infrastructure, parks, and schools to serve the development. The City may consider waiving appropriate development fees to facilitate development of affordable housing. Building and housing codes are implemented to ensure the safety of the community (housing residents, specifically).

### Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

While there are several constraints to meeting the needs of lower-income households note in the Consolidated Plan, there are two primary obstacles to meeting underserved needs:

- Available funding is not sufficient to address community needs. CDBG funding was available to public service agencies and the City provided \$104,498 in local funding for FY 23/24. The City continues to encourage nonprofits to identify other public or private funding sources.
- Most of the region's service providers are in Sacramento, Citrus Heights is home to services such as food banks, youth programs, and senior meal service providers. Citrus Heights offers public transportation to the Sacramento area, but residents are sometimes reluctant or unable to travel outside of their community to receive services.

### Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City will provide lead-abatement assistance for residential units through the Housing Rehabilitation Program. The City's Housing Rehabilitation Program guidelines include specific policies related to testing and abatement. The City contracts with a third-party firm to administer its housing repair program. This firm contracts with qualified lead abatement contractors to conduct lead-based paint identification, assessment, and clearance services to reduce lead hazard. When lead-based paint is present or presumed to be present lead-safe work practices are required. The procedures regarding lead-based

paint include notification procedures for owners, evaluation, and identification of lead hazards; requirements of repair, reduction, or abatement of the lead hazards; and clearance examinations. In addition, the program will comply with the Residential Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 (Title X) and subsequent changes in September 1999.

### Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City's anti-poverty strategy focuses on providing a range of employment opportunities and supportive services aimed at enabling those in poverty to move into the workforce, as well as supporting activities that preserve and expand the supply of housing affordable to target-income households.

- Meals on Wheels by ACC offered homebound seniors who meet eligibility requirements were provided home delivered meals, including five frozen meals once per week, or a hot meal delivered five times per week, Monday-Friday.
- Meals on Wheels by ACC also offered mobile senior's nutritious meals and social interactions for those who could participate at a Café site. The Café site at Rusch Park closed due to COVID-19, café participants had the option to receive meals from nearby café sites.
- Sacramento Self-Help Housing provided counseling and social services to homeless individuals or those at risk of becoming homeless, including drop-in counseling/office hours and case management services through June 2023.
- After the dissolution of SSHH, the City partnered with Sacramento County DHSH, to provide a Community Based Navigation Program.
- As a result of CDBG-CV funding, the City created a Supplemental Navigator Fund to provide emergency housing assistance; including temporary housing, security deposits, food, essential supplies, and necessary support for people experiencing homelessness while they receive outreach navigator services.
- Sunrise Christian Food Ministry operates an emergency food closet available to low-income persons.
- The City also provides code enforcement services and a rental housing inspection program to ensure lower-income households have a safe and decent place to live. This is not a CDBG funded activity.

Citrus Heights residents also have access to anti-poverty services provided by the County Department of Human Assistance. The County provides many programs designed to provide temporary assistance for eligible low-income residents and coordinates the County's welfare-to-work programs with an emphasis on creating employment connections and increasing the income of participants.

### Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

To eliminate gaps in institutional structures, the City remains actively involved with neighboring jurisdictions and regional governmental entities. The City coordinates with Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA) to address affordable housing needs related to public housing activities.

Recently, the City collaborated with SHRA to allocate the City's HOME funds to the Sunrise Pointe Affordable Apartment Project which was completed in December of 2023.

In addition, the City continues to collaborate with the City of Sacramento, City of Elk Grove, and City of Rancho Cordova, the two other small entitlement jurisdictions in Sacramento County, and continues to look for opportunities to increase and enhance services citywide to residents.

# Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City continues to work with neighboring jurisdictions, including the City of Rancho Cordova, City of Elk Grove, City of Folsom, County and City of Sacramento and the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency, to address the regional issues that affect the needs of low-income persons as well as special need programs, shared Subrecipient monitoring and research into issues of interest such as the Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing final rule. The City also continues to work with many of the local nonprofits that provide a range of services to low-income residents.

# Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

HUD provides specific requirements that entitlement grantees certify that they will affirmatively further fair housing in each jurisdiction. Fair Housing objectives are broad and include requirements to promote fair housing choice for all persons and to foster compliance with nondiscrimination provisions of the Fair Housing Act. These requirements are satisfied, in part, by analyzing impediments to fair housing choice within the jurisdiction and taking appropriate action to overcome the effects of identified impediments.

The City coordinated with SHRA, Sacramento County, City of Elk Grove, City of Rancho Cordova, and several other local agencies on a regional Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice. In 2020 the City completed the Sacramento Valley Fair Housing Collaborative Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI), and it was adopted by the City Council. A copy of the AI can be found on the City's website.

The goals and strategies identified in the AI to address fair housing barriers include:

- Goal 1 Incentivize and increase opportunities for development and continued availability of affordable homeownership products.
- Goal 2 Expand and preserve affordable rental opportunities.
- Goal 3 Expand equity in access to economic opportunity.

The City's approach to meeting these goals through CDBG funding in PY 2023 was focused on the following activities:

 City staff participates in a series of meetings with other regional jurisdictions, including the County of Sacramento, SHRA, Rancho Cordova, Folsom, and Elk Grove on strategies for better cooperating regionally to address fair housing issues. Since 2016, the local jurisdictions have been partnering to allocate funding for the Renters Helpline. In 2023, Citrus Heights continues to partner with the local jurisdictions in a cost sharing agreement by contributing its share based on its percentage of the County's rental units.

SSHH provided housing counseling and navigation services with additional counseling, dispute resolution and fair housing services to residents via calls and internet-based Renters Helpline through June 2023. After the dissolution of SSHH, City staff researched opportunities to continue services. City staff partnered with new service providers:

- Community Based Navigation Program. Sacramento County Department of Homeless Services and Housing to provide a Community Health Workers (CHWs) employed by Community HealthWorks who provide homeless outreach and navigation services to unsheltered individuals living in a state of homelessness with the City. This program was funded through County ARPA district-directed funding from District 4, services will continue through December 31, 2025.
- Renters Helpline Program. Through a Regional Cost Sharing Agreement, the City partnered with Project Sentinel and Community Link Capital Region (as known as 211 Sacramento) to provide a telephone and internet-based Renters Helpline, counseling, dispute resolution, fair housing services for residents in a housing crisis or dispute with the goal to reduce housing discrimination, promote public awareness of fair housing laws and rights, and assist persons with disabilities.

The City uses a monitoring system to ensure that CDBG-funded activities follow applicable laws, regulations, policies, sound management, and accounting practices. The primary objective of the City's monitoring efforts include:

- To ensure the Subrecipient has the capacity to carry out their responsibility and to do so in a timely manner.
- To ensure the Subrecipient is carrying out the project as described in their agreement, complying with applicable laws and regulations. To ensure the project is operating in a manner that minimizes the opportunity for fraud, waste, and mismanagement.

At the beginning of 2023, City staff provided a workshop for each CDBG Subrecipient, the workshops were provided via Zoom. The workshop was formatted to review federal requirements unique to CDBG, the subrecipient agreement, introduced CDBG reporting forms and answered questions. Therefore, all Subrecipients are informed of their obligations to collect the required information on income, household composition, race, and ethnicity. City staff also provides information to each Subrecipient that outlines the agreement terms and CDBG policies such as data collection and financial management. In addition, staff recommends each Subrecipient read the "Playing by the Rules" guide produced by HUD.

Monthly, staff reviews the progress the Subrecipient has been making toward achieving performance goals. City staff places a strong emphasis on its Subrecipients to provide accurate information on the persons or households served, and regularly reporting progress with each invoice.

Each Subrecipient agreement contains provisions for reduction or termination in the event goals are not accomplished or when past performance issues have not been resolved. Onsite monitoring of Subrecipients is conducted based on an annual desk assessment performed by City staff.

### Narrative

Section 3 of Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1992 (Section 3) was enacted "to ensure that the employment and other economic opportunities generated by Federal financial assistance for housing and community development program shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed towards low- and very low-income persons, particularly those who are recipients of government assistance for housing.

Section 3 applies to housing rehabilitation, housing construction, and other public construction projects that are fully or partially funded with HUD financial assistance. Projects that are financed with state, local or private matching or leveraged funds used in conjunction with HUD funds are covered by Section 3 if the amount of HUD funding for the project exceeds the regulatory threshold of \$200,000.

Effective on November 30, 2020, the new Section 3 final rule (24 CFR Part 75) was designed to improve a focus on economic opportunity outcomes while simultaneously reducing the regulatory burden on those entities that receive those funds. Key changes in the rule and in HUD's implementation include:

- Focusing on key outcome metrics, such as the sustained employment of individuals in targeted populations.
- Crediting retention of low- and very low-income employees and successful sustained employment in the reporting metrics.
- Aligning Section 3 reporting with standards business practices and payroll tracking methods.
- Allowing for tailored outcome benchmarks for different geographies and/or different projects.
- Integrating Section 3 oversight into the work of the program offices who are in regular contact with the grantee.
- Promoting the newly created portal to connect low- and very low-income people, who need jobs most, with businesses who have Section 3 job opportunities in their area.

During program year 2023, the City completed a housing rehabilitation program, the Critical Home Repair Grant Program.
